

Social Media Comment Policy

The Klamath Falls News social media team has established the following guidelines for public posts on the official Klamath Falls News social media page. Administrators of the Klamath Falls News page monitor the page and enforce the following guidelines.

Posting policies for Facebook audiences

Klamath Falls News welcomes and values respectable participation on our social media page. Klamath Falls News encourages interaction often and to comment about the content you find on our pages.

We do not discriminate against any views, but administrators of the Klamath Falls News social media page do reserve the right to moderate, hide, and/or delete comments, or block users who repeatedly violate the following:

- Posts of abusive, vulgar, obscene, racist, threatening, harassment, nudity, defamation, profanity, or hate speech.
- Libel, slander, or personal attacks of any kind, including the use of offensive terms that target specific individuals or groups.
- Comments/posts that threaten to harm individuals, groups, or organizations.
- Spam, advertising, soliciting, fundraising, or spamming are not permitted. (*Unless specifically requested*)
- Suggestions, endorsement, or encouragement of illegal, dangerous, or destructive activities or actions.
- Off topic comments or links to websites, news articles, or repetitive posts that are copied and pasted. Outside news articles must be shared from established and verified news sources.
- Duplicate posts and/or comments.
- Personal information including but not limited to e-mail addresses, telephone numbers, mailing addresses, or identification numbers.
- Posts in violation of any copyright are not permitted.

In short: Be respectful. Be smart. Be human. Add to the discussion and help grow our community in constructive ways.
